

The following map represents the population density for Ward 3 of the Town of Richmond Hill in 2011.


Please note that density is being represented across an entire dissemination area, not to the ward boundary.



**Age** refers to the last birthday before the 2011 Census reference date (May 10, 2011).


The median age of the Ward 3 population is **40.0 years old**.



**Mother tongue** refers to the first language learned at home in childhood and still understood by the individual at the time of the 2011 Census.


The most common mother tongue language in Ward 3 is **English,** at **29.2%**.

Note: Mother tongue information is based on single responses, using the same categorization as Statistics Canada for consistency in data reporting and analysis. However, it should be noted that when languages of a similar geographic or cultural origin (for example, Chinese and Chinese n.o.s.) are considered together, their impact on the ward total may be more significant than when analyzed separately.

**Ethnic origin** refers to the ethnic or cultural origins of the respondent's ancestors.

The most common ethnic origin in Ward 3 is **Chinese**, at **42.3%** of the population.


**Immigrant** refers to a person who is or has ever been a landed immigrant/permanent resident. This person has been granted the right to live in Canada permanently by immigration authorities.

The majority of immigrants to Ward 3 arrived between the years **1991 to 2000**.

Since 2001, there have been **4,704** new immigrants to Ward 3.

Since 2006, there have been **1,925** new immigrants to Ward 3.







During the 2011 reference week, **62.7%** of Ward 3's population were employed.



### Ward 3 Population by Occupation (2011)


