


Ward 6 is bound by









Mother tongue refers to the first language learned at home in childhood and still understood by the individual at the time of the 2011 Census.


The most common mother tongue language in Ward 6 is **English,** at **29.5%**.

Note: Mother tongue information is based on single responses, using the same categorization as Statistics Canada for consistency in data reporting and analysis. However, it should be noted that when languages of a similar geographic or cultural origin (for example, Chinese and Chinese n.o.s.) are considered together, their impact on the ward total may be more significant than when analyzed separately.

Top 10 Ethnic Origins (2011)



Ethnic origin refers to the ethnic or cultural origins of the respondent's ancestors.

The most common ethnic origin in Ward 6 is **Chinese**, at **33.2%** of the population.


Immigrant refers to a person who is or has ever been a landed immigrant/permanent resident. This person has been granted the right to live in Canada permanently by immigration authorities.

The majority of immigrants to Ward 5 arrived between the years **1991 to 2000**.

Since 2006, there have been **2,895** new immigrants to Ward 6.










Population with a Postsecondary Education (2011)

In Ward 6, **51.2%** of the population hold a **Bachelor's degree** or higher.





During the 2011 reference week, **60.0%** of Ward 6's population were employed.



Ward 6 Population by Occupation (2011)


